Three Day 4WD Green Season Itinerary



From November to April, the days are humid yet the rains each afternoon bring a sense of comfort to Kakadu. We call it the green season, because this is when the park comes to life - lush green plants, thriving animals and incredible skies, a truly tropical summer. The park is generally quieter during this time of year, yet there's still so much to see and do!

Day One — Welcome


Embark on your three hour drive from Darwin towards Kakadu National Park. Upon entering the park, call into Mamukala Wetlands, where you will be introduced to Kakadu's floodplain landscape teeming with wildlife.

Check into the world-famous Mercure Kakadu Crocodile Hotel in Jabiru, unpack your bags and have a cooling dip in the resort pool.

Prior to arrival

You'll need to collect a Kakadu National Parks pass to enter the park. You can either purchase the pass online before heading into the park, or from Bowali Visitor Centre upon arrival.

Check-in at the hotel is from 2pm daily.



Day One — Afternoon


Book Mercure Kakadu Crocodile Hotel

Take a scenic drive to Ubirr, a sacred site that is significant for its Aboriginal Rock Art. Experience a spectacular sunset, with 360° views of the Arnhem Land escarpment amalgamating into the floodplains.

As you traverse the ancient stone country landscape, you'll become privy to the artistry and cultural heritage that defines this extraordinary UNESCO World Heritage Listed National Park.

Guided tour

Most rental cars do not allow driving at night in Kakadu. Never Never Safari Tours is an option if this is the case for your visit, offering a pick-up and drop-off from the Crocodile Hotel. Book Never Never Safari Tour to Ubirr



Return to Mercure Crocodile Hotel for an airconditioned, indoor dining experience at Manimukmuk Restaurant and Bar.

Day Two — Morning

Enjoy a buffet breakfast at the Croc Hotel before walking across the road to visit Marrawuddi Arts & Culture; a vibrant working space for local artists with a beautiful exhibition area and delicious coffee.

Next, head toward <u>Bowali Visitor Information</u> <u>Centre</u>, which is designed and inspired by an Aboriginal Rock Shelter, with a wealth of information and background to the Park's heritage and evolution.

Cultural learning

The town of Jabiru is
Traditionally Owned and
situated on Mirarr Clan
Country. Marrawuddi Arts &
Culture and Bowali Visitor
Centre both provide insight
into the deep history of
these lands, Bininj/Mungguy
(Aboriginal) people and
their traditional practices
that are still very present in
local communities.



Day Two — Day

Visit <u>Burrungkuy (Nourlangie)</u> for a visual odyssey through time — an open-air cultural museum. The paintings, shelters and artefacts vividly showcase traditional ways of life from various epochs, offering a captivating glimpse into the rich heritage of the area. A 1.5 km circular walk leads to the base, with wheelchair-accessible sections.

For something extra, explore the moderate 6 km return Kubara pools walk.

Guided tour

Join local Bininj (Aboriginal) tour guides on a 2 hr tour of Burrungkuy/Nourlangie rock art, where you'll learn about the cultural, and family stories of the last great rock art painter in Kakadu. Book Yibekka



Day Two — Afternoon

Check-in to Cooinda Lodge, the resort-style oasis in Kakadu's southern area.

Explore the Ngurrungurudjba, <u>Yellow Water Billabong</u> by joining the afternoon Yellow Water Cruise. As the sun paints the water's surface with a warm golden glow, the billabong exhibits its basking crocodiles, vibrant birdlife, and the tranquil rhythm of nature.

Take a refreshing dip in the lagoon swimming pool before heading inside the air-conditioned Mimi's restaurant for an à la carte dinner service.

The food menu promotes local ingredients and the native flavours of Kakadu. Meanwhile, the extensive wine and bar menu features local brewers, NT distillers, signature cocktails and non-alcoholic spritzes.

Day Three — Morning

Enjoy a morning buffet breakfast, baristamade coffees and fresh juices at Cooinda before check-out at 10am.

Visit <u>Warradjan Aboriginal Cultural Centre</u> on upon departing Cooinda for an insight into culture in Kakadu with an interactive museum, art exhibit and meeting place to sit on country and weave with Bininj artists and Murumburr Traditional Owners.

Cultural learning

Warradjan's exhibit is curated by and central to the local Bininj/Mungguy (Aboriginal) community, and it tells the stories of their land, people and Dreamtime.

Day Three — Day

Begin the 1 hour drive south of Cooinda toward Yurmikmik walks to two of the park's most formidable swimming spots.

First, take a refreshing dip at <u>Boulder Creek</u>, just a short stroll from the Yurmikmik Trails car park. Immerse yourself in the lush monsoon forest and relax by the shaded plunge pool. You might fall in love with this spot and decide to spend the entire day here.

Before you go

The nearest services including food, water, fuel and wifi are available at Cooinda Lodge, about 1.5 hours drive from the carpark, so please ensure you are prepared before your adventure! Remember to pack: sunscreen, hat, walking shoes, insect repellent and plenty of food and water!



Day Three — Afternoon

For those seeking more of an adventure, your next stop is <u>Motor Car Falls</u>, a true Kakadu gem! The trail meanders through the monsoon forest for about 4km before you reach the waterfall. Relax and enjoy the beautiful freshwater pool at the base of the falls and shaded boulders to escape the heat.

Boh boh (bye bye), head back to Darwin or onto Pine Creek.

Important note

The insects are especially uncomfortable during the green season, so it's important to make sure you have a heavy duty insect repellent! You can purchase some 'Good Riddance' repellent from the Cooinda Lodge retail store prior to departure.

Guluyambi Ubirr Wet Season

If you are travelling to Kakadu during the monsoon time and this Kakadu Cultural Tour is operating - it is a MUST! See Ubirr Rock Art via a boat cruise across the floodplains and learn about traditional Bininj ways of life. Pick up is at 8.30am, returning you by 2pm to your Jabiru accommodation.
