Seven Day 4WD Dry Season Itinerary



From May to October, it is the dry season in Kakadu National Park, with cooler temperatures around 17°C to 30°C, making it Kakadu's peak visiting season. Most waterfalls stop flowing and the floodplains quickly dry out, while the low water levels in the billabongs and floodplain reveal an explosion of wildlife activity.

Kakadu seasons

There are three different Kakadu seasons during the dry time. Visit Kakadu Parks Access Report for updates on what is open during your time of travel.



Day One — Welcome

Embark on your three hour drive from Darwin towards Kakadu National Park. Upon entering the park, call into <u>Mamukala Wetlands</u>, where you will be introduced to Kakadu's floodplain landscape teeming with wildlife.

Check into the world-famous Mercure Kakadu Crocodile Hotel in Jabiru, unpack your bags and have a cooling dip in the resort pool.

Prior to arrival

You'll need to collect a Kakadu National Parks pass to enter the park. You can either purchase the pass online before heading into the park, or from Bowali Visitor Centre upon arrival.

Check-in at the hotel is from 2pm daily.



Day One — Afternoon

Take a scenic drive to <u>Ubirr</u>, a sacred site that is significant for its Aboriginal Rock Art. Experience a spectacular sunset, with 360° views of the Arnhem Land escarpment amalgamating into the floodplains.

As you traverse the ancient stone country landscape, you'll become privy to the artistry and cultural heritage that defines this extraordinary UNESCO World Heritage Listed National Park.

Guided tour

Most rental cars do not allow driving at night in Kakadu. Never Never Safari Tours is an option if this is the case for your visit, offering a pick-up and drop-off from the Crocodile Hotel. Book Never Never Safari Tour to Ubirr



Day One — Evening

Return to Mercure Crocodile Hotel for an airconditioned, indoor dining experience at Manjmukmuk Restaurant and Bar.

Day Two — Morning

Enjoy a buffet breakfast at the Croc Hotel before walking across the road to visit Marrawuddi Arts & Culture; a vibrant working space for local artists with a beautiful exhibition area and delicious coffee.

Next, head toward <u>Bowali Visitor Information</u> <u>Centre</u>, which is designed and inspired by an Aboriginal Rock Shelter, with a wealth of information and background to the Park's heritage and evolution.

Cultural learning

The town of Jabiru is
Traditionally Owned and
situated on Mirarr Clan
Country. Marrawuddi Arts &
Culture and Bowali Visitor
Centre both provide insight
into the deep history of
these lands, Bininj/Mungguy
(Aboriginal) people and
their traditional practices
that are still very present in
local communities.




Day Two — Day

Visit <u>Burrungkuy (Nourlangie)</u> for a visual odyssey through time — an open-air cultural museum. The paintings, shelters and artefacts vividly showcase traditional ways of life from various epochs, offering a captivating glimpse into the rich heritage of the area.

Explore the moderate 6km return scenic walk amongst the monsoon forest to <u>Kubara pools</u>. Listen to the water cascading over boulders while you spot wallabies, lizards and birdlife.

Guided tour

Join local Bininj (Aboriginal) tour guides on a 2 hr tour of Burrungkuy/Nourlangie rock art, where you'll learn about the cultural, and family stories of the last great rock art painter in Kakadu. Book Yibekka



Day Two — Afternoon

Journey along the short 600m trail to <u>Nawurlandja lookout</u>.

Boasting a panorama of views across Anbangbang Billabong to Burrungkuy (Nourlangie Rock) and the Arnhem Land escarpment, this lookout is the ultimate spot for nature enthusiasts and photographers alike.

Day Two — Evening

Return to Mercure Crocodile Hotel for an airconditioned, indoor dining experience at Manjmukmuk Restaurant and Bar.

Signature beverage

Satisfy your outback thirst with the signature cocktail, 'Kakadu Mule.' This refreshing drink features locally crafted NT Willing Distillery Vodka, a kick of Strangelove hot ginger beer, and the zest of fresh lime juice, all perfectly balanced with a hint of mint.





Day Three — Morning

Enjoy a buffet breakfast at the Croc Hotel before driving north toward world-renowned <u>Cahills Crossing</u> and witness the congregation of crocodiles from the newly established viewing platform.

While you're there, check out the Ubirr <u>Border Store</u> by Injalak Arts, where you can find local crafts and pieces of art made in Gunbalanya, West Arnhem Land.

Anhemlander tour

Get picked up outside the hotel at 7.50am for an exploration of sandstone escarpment outcrops, rock art sites, forests, floodplains and billabongs from a 4WD bus. The tour includes permits and visits the Injalak Arts outlet at the Border Store. Returns guests to the hotel at 4pm. Book Arnhemlander Tour



Day Three — Day

Spend the day exploring Gunbalanya and the fruits of West Arnhem Land, keeping in mind you'll need to obtain a special permit to enter this Indigenous land.

Visit <u>Injalak Arts</u>, an Aboriginal community safe place for culture, creativity and knowledge. See artists at work and bear witness to traditional ways of sharing culture. Make a stop at Gunbalanya Meats for some local butcher favourites such as Buffalo.

Before you go

A permit is required to visit the Aboriginal lands in Arnhem Land which are arranged through the Northern Land Council (NLC). To obtain your permit, register here and submit your application.



Day Three — Evening

Return to Mercure Crocodile Hotel for a refreshing swim and cocktail by the pool.

Seat another dinner at the Manjmukmuk restaurant, or try the local Thai Restaurant, next to Anbinik Resort and just a short 5 min walk from the Croc Hotel. The Jabiru favourite has a great Thai menu, with cold beverages to compliment the balmy alfresco dining.

Artist in residence

Make sure to pop by the Mercure Kakadu Crocodile Hotel's Ochre Art Gallery to see if any artists are in the studio. It is encouraged to say hello and sit down with the Bininj artists, as they love sharing their culture and heritage with visitors. Shop Ochre Art Gallery



Day Four — Morning to Day

Enjoy a buffet breakfast at the Croc Hotel before beginning the 2 hour drive toward the park's most formidable waterfall, <u>Jim Jim</u> Falls.

The 2km walk through sandy tracks and rocky terrains rewards visitors with a large plunge pool at the base of the falls. Take a refreshing swim and soak in towering cliffs and ancient rock formations.

Important note

Make sure to check that Jim Jim Falls is open and road conditions. Creek crossing with firm concrete base can be more than 0.4 metres deep. A vehicle snorkel is highly recommended.

Day Four — Afternoon

For those seeking a more physical adventure after Jim Jim Falls, Twin Falls Plateau serves as a moderately challenging hike with panoramic views over the West Arnhem Land escarpment. Enjoy the delicious swimming holes at the top of the falls before making vour descent back to the car.

Before you go

The nearest services including food, water, fuel and wifi are available at Cooinda Lodge, about 1.5 hours drive from the carpark, so please ensure you are prepared before your adventure! Remember to pack: sunscreen, hat, walking shoes, insect repellent and plenty of food and water!



Day Four — Evening

Head to Mimi's restaurant for an indoor à la carte service with signature dishes, or opt for alfresco Barra Bar, adorned with fairy lights for a balmy outdoor dining experience.

Alternatively, try the pop-up Too Deadly Takeaway Fish and Chip Van or Smoking Croc BBQ House for a more casual option upon the grassy outdoor area.

Signature dish

For quality meat and fresh flavours, try the Rum Jungle Buffalo Fillet. Enjoy tangy carrot and ginger, rosella jus, and a hint of sweetness from Davidson plum and native currant chutney. Download menu



Day Five — Morning

Wake up early to catch the 6.45am dawn Yellow Water Cruise upon the Ngurrungurrudjba (Yellow Water Billabong). Witness the golden glow upon the water's surface, awakening crocodiles, vibrant birdlife, and the tranquil rhythm of nature.

Return in time for breakfast, barista-made coffees and fresh juices at Cooinda before check-out at 10am.

Day Five — Day

Take the 1km walking track or short drive to Warradjan Aboriginal Cultural Centre for an insight into culture in Kakadu with an interactive museum, art exhibit and meeting place to sit on country and weave with Binini artists and Murumburr Traditional Owners.

Return to Cooinda Lodge for a dip in the lagoon pool before a delicious buffet lunch at Mimi's Restaurant or a snack from the cafe!

Cultural learning

Warradjan's exhibit is curated by and central to the local Bininj/Mungguy (Aboriginal) community, and it tells the stories of their land, people and Dreamtime. Shop Warradjan Art





Day Five — Overnight

Day Six — Day

Head to Maguk (Barramundi Gorge), where the short scenic walk through lush monsoon forest leads to a serene plunge pool, inviting visitors to take a refreshing swim surrounded by ancient rock formations.

As another option, or if you have time to see both — visit upper and lower Ikoymarrwa falls, also known as Moline Rockhole. This accessible destinations offers incredible swimming and a panorama of views.

Hot tip

Make sure to pack your snorkelling gear, as the crystal-clear waters reveal an underwater world teeming with small fish. If luck is on your side, you might even share the aquatic space with a warradjan (pig-nosed turtle)!



Return to Cooinda Lodge for an early dinner seating at Mimi's restaurant or Barra Bar.

Take the Algohgarrng Stargazing Tour aboard a Yellow Water Vessel from 7.30pm to 8.30pm. Experience the spectacle of Kakadu's night sky, showcasing stars, planets, constellations and ancestral spirits from the Dreamtime above Kakadu National Park.

Another option

Day Seven — Opt 1

These flights offer a unique perspective on the park's stunning landscapes, from cascading waterfalls to ancient rock formations. Boh boh (bye bye) drive back to Darwin or onto Pine Creek.
