Kakadu is the oldest living indigenous culture on earth. It has been home to Aboriginal people for more than 65,000 years and they are ready to share their landscape, heritage, culture and stories with you. It is a dual listed UNESCO World Heritage site and the biggest National Park within Australia.







The village style property is located beneath a canopy of trees beside Yellow Water Billabong, home to world-renowned Yellow Water Cruises, where crocodiles and birds are seen on the flood plain amongst Paperbark, Pandanus and Fresh Water Mangroves.

Authentic Cultural Experiences with Traditional Owners.

Located nearby Cooinda Kakadu The Billabong Safari Camp offers groups bespoke cultural experiences with Traditional Owners and family of the Murumburr clan. The clan and affiliate families continue to live in the unique Kakadu National Parks, where culture and tradition still remains strong. The traditional land owners thrive on the many bush foods that the six different seasons bring. The Murumburr clan and our family members welcome you to come and have a taste of a real "living cultural experience", and of their daily lives. Experiences are all customisable for groups and include anything from an authentic bushtucker walking tour to learning to play the didgeridoo to language classes to weaving and many more.

KAKADU PAINTING CLASSES

Learn all about First Nations culture from Jacquie Cahill, a South Alligator woman and grand-daughter of the last chief of the Ngombur clan group, Walter Barlmarr-Cahill. Held at Mercure Kakadu Crocodile Hotel you will learn how to paint and get to take home your artwork.

KAKADU CULTURAL COOKING CLASSES

WEAVING & DAMPER MAKING WITH TRADITIONAL OWNERS

Join some of the traditional owners of country at the Warradjan Culture Centre as they teach you the art of weaving and damper-making the Kakadu way, a very important social & cultural activity for the females of Aboriginal culture. Join the sharing of experiences and knowledge passed from generation to generation, and produce your own work of art to remember your time in Kakadu. Explore the Murrumburr clan's rich culture and heritage during a self-guided walk of the museum.

AIR KAKADU

Kakadu Air offer a range of scenic flight options that suit any traveler's budget. From short scenic tours which depart daily from both Jabiru and Cooinda to all-day adventurous tours from Darwin. Charter flights for groups direct from Darwin to Kakadu accommodation can be arranged.

TRADITIONAL ABORIGINAL GROUND OVEN DINNER UNDER THE STARS

Experience the most ancient living indigenous culture in the world through their food. Learn the ways of cooking from local Bininj and try local meats like water buffalo, wallaby, emu, barramundi, magpie geese, whatever has been hunted for the day. Taste the Kakadu flavours that have been foraged from country in the heart of Kakadu. Includes beverages and dinner, available for groups of up to 200 people.

ANIMAL TRACKS

Hands-on aboriginal experiences with a 100% bush Aboriginal guide who was born in the bush and grew up in rock and bark shelters. Our safari has exclusive access to wildlife rich wetlands and tropical savannah woodland within Kakadu National Park including exclusive access to a seasonal unbelievable bird gathering spectacle.

The highlight is a bird gathering phenomenon occurring from mid July to September (approximately) that only we can show you. Our words can't explain the experience. This is our sunset cooking location for that period. Buffalo, wallaby, crocodile, goanna, snakes, turtle, dingo, wild pigs, various nocturnal animals and many bird species are regularly seen and interpretation is provided from both aboriginal and non-Aboriginal perspective.


TASTE OF KAKADU FESTIVAL
